

PARENT INVOLVEMENT

STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS

St. Maries Joint School District No. 41 agrees to implement the following statutory requirements:

1. All Title I programs, activities, and procedures will be planned and operated with meaningful consultation with parents.
2. All Title I schools will develop and implement school-level parent involvement that includes, as a component, a school-parent compact.
3. St. Maries Joint School District No. 41's Title I Parent Involvement Policy will be incorporated into the Consolidated State and Federal Grant Application.
4. To the extent possible, St. Maries Joint School District No. 41 and its schools will provide full opportunities for the participation of parents with limited English proficiency, parents with disabilities, and parents of migratory students, including providing information and school reports in an understandable and uniform format, and including alternative formats upon request, and to the extent possible, in a language parents understand.
5. St. Maries Joint School District No. 41 will submit any parent comments with the Consolidated Federal and State Grant Application (CFSGA) when the School District submits the Plan to the Idaho State Department of Education.
6. The School District will involve the parents of students served in Title I Schools as to how Title I funds reserved for parent involvement are spent.
