A Message from Alica M. Holthaus Superintendent

It seems only a few days ago that I was tasked with writing my first Message from the Superintendent and now, a year later, I begin the process of writing my second message. In reflecting on the past year, I am proud of the progress of the District, and will continue to work with the administrative team to identify and plan further improvements for the 2018-2019 school year.



During the last year, it was a District goal to increase communication with our parents, guardians, and community. Working toward that goal, we instituted a mass communication program, Skylert, to better communicate with our patrons in the event of a weather-related emergency school closure as well as provide an efficient avenue for news releases. Skylert allows us to efficiently send recorded phone messages as well as email messages to parents and guardians. We believe that

this program has helped us improve our communication. Another step towards our improved communications goal was to increase the number of parent contact efforts. Our staff made and documented more than 6000 parent contacts during the last school year as we believe that working together with the parents/guardians is the best way to help our students learn and achieve.

A second focus was to review and adjust school policy so that it matched the needs of our students, parents, community, and insurance providers as well as state and federal mandates. The Board has adopted amendments to our teacher and administrator evaluation process, co-curricular athletic code, co-curricular drug testing, facility use, and attendance policies. These policy changes improve safety, clarify our expectations and will help us develop students that will be college and career ready.

Over the summer, we have completed two projects that I feel will best promote school safety as well as make our

schools more welcoming to our families and patrons. The first one was to move the office entrance of Heyburn Elementary School to the main floor and the second one was to create a direct school office entry at St. Maries Middle School. Visitors to both buildings will now be identified by staff as they enter the building and will be provided with appropriate access. Visitors will no longer be asked to climb an additional set of stairs or have direct access to students as they pass through the halls making their way to the school offices in these two buildings.

In the upcoming year, we plan to continue to grow and refine our school system to meet the demands of educating our children as we are “Committed to Quality Education.” Please join us in making the schools in St. Maries Joint School District No. 41 the best place possible for our children to learn and grow.

All day kindergarten new for 2018-19

The phrase “Everything I needed to know I learned in Kindergarten” is well known by many of us as the poem about lifelong lessons absorbed through our journey in kindergarten. What is not written in that poem is the academic requirements that continue to increase each year for our students as they move up through the grade levels. Our students are required earlier and earlier to show mastery of concepts that are foundational to the rest of their educational career.

At St. Maries School District we recognize the increased demands on our students and strive to provide them with the skills for a successful educational career. The staff and administration feel that offering a full day kindergarten program to our students will enhance their social interactions, expand their exposure to key concepts, allow them the time to experience learning while at play, and extend the time given to important necessary subjects allowing them to excel in future grades.

During their time in a full day classroom experience, they will receive enrichment and exposure to language, a

rich environment of manipulatives and hands on, sensory experiences, as well as extended opportunities to interact with other students and staff which will assist in their readiness for the higher demands of first grade.

As a District we feel that the previous half day classroom was not aiding our students with understanding the needed learning in letter naming and sounds, number concepts and naming, recognition of self and community, ideas of citizenship, and concepts of social interaction in learning play. Instead, we were sending students into the future grades without the true mastery needed for a strong foundation of skills to be built upon.

St. Maries School District is excited to provide full day Kindergarten to our students at the beginning of the upcoming year, 2018-2019. We will be expanding the programs at both the Heyburn Elementary and UpRiver Elementary to support the full day curriculum. We look forward to watching our students grow and flourish with the additional enrichment this addition will provide!

Kindergarten registration & screening

Heyburn Elementary will hold its registration and screening for incoming kindergarten students for the 2018-2019 school year on August 13 and 14, 2018. UpRiver School will hold its registration for kindergarten students on August 16 and 17, 2018.

Registration and student screening will take place at Heyburn Elementary School. Parents should call the District Office at (208) 245-2579 or Heyburn Elementary School at (208) 245-2025 to make an appointment to

complete the registration and screening processes.

Children must be five years of age as of September 1, 2018 to be eligible for enrollment in the 2018-2019 school year.

All new students must present their state certified birth certificate and proof of immunization at the time of registration.
